#1. Wednesday, March 10, 2010	P104 – Evidence Based Prevention Models (CPS and Recert 6 hours)	Pamela Clark, MPH, CHES, CPS, PLB Clark Consulting, LLCA	What does science have to do with prevention? This class will answer that question as well as many others. Sources for evidence based prevention programs, fidelity and adaptation will be presented and ways to draw meaningful interpretations of evaluation results will be included. Anyone seeking funding for prevention programs should attend this workshop to learn what is on the cutting edge in the prevention field.
#2. Tuesday, March 16, 2010	Co-Occurring Assessment (Recert 6 hours)	Mary Beth McDonald, MA, LPC, LCADC, Independent Practitioner at MSB Counseling, Consultation and Training in Denville, NJ	This course will describe how to screen and assess for clients with co-occurring disorders. Often these clients present with symptoms that make it challenging to accurately assess what is happening with them. Discussion and clarification on the similarities and differences in some of these clinical presentations will occur in this course.
#3. Saturday, March 20, 2010	Fears, Phobias and Anxiety in the Recovering Alcoholic/Addict (Recert 6 hours)	Barry Bocchieri MA, CAD/C, Lead Counselor, Lyons VA Hospital	This course will focus on the treatment of fears, phobias and anxiety using the techniques of the late great Australian physician Dr. Claire Weeks. Topics included will be: what is sensitization; the five symptoms of nervous illness and how to cure yourself; a simple four-step method for recovery from nervous illness; how to solve a seemingly insoluble problem; and how to deal with setbacks. This course is for beginners and advanced alike.
#4. Tuesday, March 23, 2010	Gangs 101 (Recert 6 hours)	Joseph Hodges CASAC, CAC, Project Director at TASC (Treatment Alternatives for Safer Communities) of Orange County, Goshen, NY	Gangs 101 will give an overview of what gangs are and are not. Further, it will clarify the similarities and differences in the different gangs and identify warning signs in communities.
#5. Wednesday, March 24, 2010	P105 – Prevention Program Evaluation (CPS and Recert 6 hours)	Pamela Clark, MPH, CHES, CPS, PLB Clark Consulting, LLC	Evaluation is NOT a dirty word! In this course participants will develop a better understanding of the Strategic Prevention Framework, explore the different types of evaluations and how to decide when to use each, and learn about different data collection methods that are user friendly and meaningful. Novice as well as experienced prevention staff is encouraged to attend to find out how to make their programs' evaluation design and results works for them.
#6. Wednesday, April 7, 2010	P201 – Dynamics and Process of ATOD Dependency and Abuse (CPS and Recert 6 hours)	Pamela Clark, MPH, CHES, CPS, PLB Clark Consulting, LLCA	In P201 participants will identify major drug categories, learn about the addiction spectrum from abstinence to dependency and different models of ATOD abuse in all contexts of the bio-psycho-social-spiritual model. Defense mechanisms common to addicts and alcoholics will also be discussed. P201 is a core class for those planning to take the CPS exam and an excellent refresher for more seasoned professionals. This class reminds us how we can make a difference in the lives of our clients or in the communities where we work.

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#7. Friday, April 9, 2010	Seniors and Substance Abuse (Recert 6 hours)	Dr. Elizabeth Hill, PhD, LCADC, CCS Clinical Director, Blake Recovery Center at Carrier Clinic	Senior citizens who abuse or have the potential to abuse alcohol and other substances present as a unique population. This group is growing in number and has specific needs and problems. Healthcare professionals must be able to identify the senior abuser in a variety of settings; addiction professionals must be able to meet the needs of the patient, the family and the community. This course will outline the salient issues and possible interventions that are integral to the subject.
#8. Saturday, April 10, 2010	The GLBT Client (Recert 6 hours)	John Cameron M. Ed. LCADC, CASAC, Private Practitioner Probation Officer, County of Orange, State of NY	How have GLBT (Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual, Transgender) issues become more mainstream, if indeed they have? Learn about this and other issues specific to the GLBT community and how substance abuse impacts those communities.
#9. Tuesday, April 20, 2010	Legal Standards (Recert 6 hours)	Ward Dunnican AB., M.Ed., LCADC	This presentation is intended to provide training in the statutes and regulations that govern the practice of alcohol and drug counseling in New Jersey.
#10. Wednesday, April 21, 2010	Substance Abuse Prevention in Faith Communities (Recert 6 hours)	Pamela Clark, MPH, CHES, CPS, PLB Clark Consulting, LLCA	This course is intended to increase the understanding of the role the faith community plays in preventing substance abuse and to identify resources and assets of individual groups within faith communities. Faith-based efforts in New Jersey will be identified as well.
#11. Saturday, May 1, 2010	Motivating Adolescents in Recovery (Recert 6 hours)	Barry Bocchieri MA, CADC, Lead Counselor, Lyons VA Hospital	Are you dealing with adolescents? You can't get them into treatment, or once in treatment, you're discouraged by the high relapse rate? Then come spend an interesting and informative day with Barry Bocchieri as he shares with you methods and techniques for "Motivating Adolescents in Recovery." Topics discussed will include motivational counseling for adolescents; how to do an assessment; how to develop a hook point to get your clients to come back; how to set up a motivational counseling group; and learning the difference between treatment and pre-treatment and how to utilize both.
#12. Wednesday, May 5, 2010	P202- Impact of Substance Abuse on Families and Larger Systems (CPS and Recert 6 hours)	Pamela Clark, MPH, CHES, CPS, PLB Clark Consulting, LLCA	P202 is designed to explore the complex relationship of family dysfunction, alcohol and drug abuse and prevention. Interactive exercises will be used to present adaptive roles and defense mechanisms of both addicted individuals and their family members. Strategies for assisting individuals and families will be discussed in depth.
#13. Friday, May 7, 2010	Personality Disorders and The Substance Abuser (Recert 6 hours)	Brian Hontz MA, LPC, NCC, CAC, ICADC, Family Advocacy Representative, Assistant to the Clinical Director, Fleet and Family Support Center, NAS JRB Willow Grove, PA	This course will provide an in-depth look at the topic of personality disorders and the substance abuser. This will include DSM IV-TR overview and history of the personality disorder. Normal vs. dysfunctional personality functioning will be examined as well as each of the ten personality disorders listed in the DSM IV-TR.

LCADC, CASAC, Private Practitioner Probation Officer, County of Orange, State of NY	This course will increase awareness of boundary vulnerabilities with clients, colleagues and other agencies as well as discussion of renewing as a professional to maintain professional integrity.

Wednesday, May 19, 2010	P203 – Prevention Issues with Special Population (CPS and Recert 6 hours)	Pamela Clark, MPH, CHES, CPS, PLB Clark Consulting, LLCA	You can't put a round peg into a square hole. P203 will present information about children, adolescents, older adults, GLBTQ Individuals, Individuals with disabilities, individuals with mental illness and professionals to help the prevention specialist make programming relevant to the target audience. This interactive class will benefit prevention staff by identifying community resources and risk factors specific to each population
#16. Friday, May 21, 2010	Legal Standards (Recert 6 hours)	Dr. Elizabeth Hill PhD, LCADC, CCS Clinical Director, Blake Recovery Center at Carrier Clinic, Belle Meade, NJ	This class presents a second opportunity to renew knowledge of the legal statutes for New Jersey in the field of alcohol and drug counseling
#17. Tuesday, May 25, 2010	Intensive Supervision Programs 101 (Recert 6 hours)	Ward Dunnican AB., M.Ed., LCADC	This class will provide a history of ISP, its structure and the multiple roles of officers in an ISP. Further discussion will include determining appropriate treatment and support for individuals identified for ISP, including preparation of material that meets the needs of the individual's cognitive level.
#18. Tuesday, June 1, 2010	Criminal Justice Clients (Recert 6 hours)	Joseph Hodges CASAC, CAC, Project Director at TASC (Treatment Alternatives for Safer Communities) of Orange County, Goshen, NY	Participants will understand the impact of alcohol and other drugs abused in the criminal justice population. Participants will become familiar with the goals of those concerned with treating the criminal justice client as well as having a basic knowledge of systems and the collaboration between different systems. Approaches to dealing with the criminal justice client will also be discussed.
#19. Wednesday, June 2, 2010	P204 – Prevention of Violent and Compulsive Behaviors (CPS and Recert 6 hours)	Pamela Clark, MPH, CHES, CPS, PLB Clark Consulting, LLCA	This course will reinforce the correlation between substance abuse and the eight different types of violence, including domestic violence, gangs, school violence, hate crimes, and child abuse among others. The role of the perpetrator and victim will be discussed. The course will also focus on specific compulsive behaviors including gambling, eating disorders and gaming.
#20. Wednesday, June 9, 2010	Preventing the #1 Cause of Teen Death: Driver and Passenger Safety (Recert 6 hours)	Pamela Clark, MPH, CHES, CPS, PLB Clark Consulting, LLCA	This course will discuss the magnitude of unsafe teen driving behaviors and demonstrate the need for customized preventative and intervention strategies. Discussion of physical, emotional, cognitive and social needs specific to the 16-19 age group will also be focused upon. A must for driving instructors and high school health teachers who deal with this topic.
#21. Saturday, June 12, 2010	Harm Reduction	John Cameron M. Ed. LCADC, CASAC, Private Practitioner Probation Officer, Orange, NY	Using role playing and other techniques, this class will discuss what Harm Reduction means to each counselor and focus on some specific Harm Reduction Models.
